#### **Speed Meeting**

23 JUN | 14:00 | AUDITORIUM

After being welcomed by the organizers, the participants and the guests are invited to take part in what has become a tradition at Training Ground: the Speed Meeting. Scandar Copti's Method for Working with Non-Actors

Scandar Copti's filmmaking approach, Singular Drama, taps into the paradox of fiction - our ability to react authentically to situations we know aren't real. Instead of coaching performances, Copti helps non-actors drop acting entirely

and respond with honest, instinctive emotions. In this session, he'll present his method and explain how he builds characters and scenes that allow non-actors to respond naturally without memorizing lines or performing rehearsed actions. The result is a film that stavs true to the screenplay's structure while unfolding through real, unscripted emotional reactions.
